1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Our parent institution Navgan Shikshan Sanstha Rajuri (Navgan) is a renowned educational institution in Beed district. It is popular for providing quality education especially in rural area. The visionary benevolent socio-educational leadership of Beed district Late Sau. Kesharbai Sonajirao Kshirsagar alias 'Kaku', the former Member of Parliament from Beed district, established Navgan Shikshan Sanstha Rajuri in 1963 visualizing to provide primary to higher education to that strata of the society which was deprived of educational facilities and development. The Sanstha eventually established medical college, agriculture college, education and physical education, military school, nursing school in the district.

Brief History:

With a view to create educational, social, political and economic awareness amongst the people of remote hilly and draught prone area of Patoda, the Navgan Shikshan Sanstha established Vasantdada Patil Arts, Commerce and Science College in 1989. The college is permanently affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. The college is 'Co-education' type. It is situated in rural area.

The college received UGC recognition under 2 (f) and 12 (B) in 2007. It is awarded 'B' grade by NAAC Bangalore in the first cycle of accreditation in 2004 and 'B+' in the second cycle of reaccreditation in 2012. The college received 'B++' grade with CGPA 2.76 in the third cycle reaccreditation.

The Executive Committee: The general body of **Navgan Shikshan Sanstha** elects the Executive Committee. The committee consists of nine members. It is the central body authenticating all policy matters.

College Development Committee: The CDC has fifteen members including the principal. The principal is the member secretary of the committee. The meetings of CDC are organized twice a year.

The Principal: The principal acts as the head of both academic and administrative wings of the college.

The College Office: The Establishment, Account, Academic, Store sections of the office deal with the matters of staff record, finance, admissions, examinations, correspondence with the university and

government etc.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell: The IQAC is constituted as per the guidelines of NAAC. The IQAC is responsible to run all academic activities effectively and smoothly.

Administrative and Academic Committees: Thirty Seven committees are formed to run administrative and academic activities smoothly. The committees seek independent decisions for improvements in various areas.

Organizational Structure: The general body of the parent institute **Navgan Shikshan Sanstha** is the apex governing body. The general body approves and monitors institutional policies and plans. For smooth conduct of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and administration related activities, the college has formed 37 independent committees. These committees call their members for periodic meetings so as to discuss and decide plan of action. At the end of academic year, each committee submits its annual report and also its perspective plan/calendar for the following academic year.

Principal, Vice Principals and College Committees: Principal as the head of the institute pays very minute attention towards administrative and academic activities. The college administration looks into the work related to eligibility, admission, examination, whereas all the different committees take care of maintaining the daily record, interacting with stake holders, etc. Teaching and support staff play an important role in executing curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular programs. **College Development Committee:** The College Development Committee, formerly known as Local Management Committee, includes 15 members, constituted according to the Maharashtra University Act, 2016. 6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

There is a College Development Committee (CDC) at the institute level. The final decisions regarding budget allocation and expenditures are approved by **Executive Committee** of Navgan Shikshan Santha. The expenses of the salary for Teaching, Non-teaching and Support Staff, Academic Activities and other Miscellaneous are done through sanctioned budget by government. Construction and Development of

Building, Purchase of Furniture, Equipment, Computers & Printers, Electrical Equipment Installation & Fittings, Landscaping is allocated by Navgan Shikshan Sanstha. The institute allocates adequate budget for the above mentioned head and utilizes it accordingly. The funds are allocated to conduct guest lectures, workshops, placement drives and training by Navgan Shikshan Sanstha. Adequate funds are utilized for the development and maintenance of the infrastructure of the institute towards the upkeep of the tangible fixed assets, repairs and maintenance of administrative areas, laboratories, classrooms, etc. Requisite funds are utilized for enhancing library facilities.

The college takes every possible effort towards resource mobilization and generating funds beyond the salary grant received from the Government of Maharashtra, and revenue generated from the self- financed courses.

Faculty were financially supported to attend seminars/conferences/workshops through the contributed funds raised by Staff Welfare Committee

The College constantly scouts for opportunities to receive grants and financial assistance from various Government Agencies.

The college is fully aided by the Govt. of Maharashtra and included under section 2(f) section 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. Thus College is fully eligible to receive the grants under various schemes of UGC.

IQAC and UGC Committee is always alert in mobilizing funds and it has developed some systematic procedures for the optimal utilization of resources. The affiliating University serves as backbone to grant funds for various academic activities. The amount received from UGC is used for development of diversified areas of the college.

Funds and grants received by various agencies are utilized properly under the headings the amount is granted for. UGC Committee of the college ensures submission of utilization certificate in time so that next installments are released.

Optimal utilization of available financial and non-financial resources is done at the campus through meticulous planning.

BEST PRACTICE: I

BLOOD DONORS' DIRECTORY

Goal: Our goal, in this best practice, is to extend a helping hand to community. This social activity of our

institution is very much appreciated by the people. We publish the directory

of blood donors of our college to help society.

The context: The patients admitted in the hospitals need blood in emergencies. Many times the blood of specific rare group is not available in the blood bank of hospitals. It may become the moment of 'life and death' for the patient. We decided to enlist the information of our blood donor students so as to provide blood to the patients in emergencies.

The Practice: We determine blood group of students at entry level classes. The names, contact numbers and detailed addresses of the students are enlisted. We publish this

information in society in the form of a directory. Thus, we extend a helping hand to the needy people. The *Health Care Committee* of our college provides the blood group determination

service also in the adopted villages during NSS youth camps.

Evidence of Success: We notice that every year needy patients contacted us. The list of around **955** blood donors of last five years is available with us. The directory is already published. The authority of Blood Bank of District Civil Hospital also appreciated us for our valuable contribution. We organized Blood Donation Camps every year. Total **189 donors** donated blood during last five years.

Problems encountered and Resources Required: While conducting blood group determination service initially very few students responded positively. The students realized the significance of this service when the college created sense of social awareness amongst them. Presently, a large number of students are getting their blood groups detected.

BEST PRACTICE: II

FULL AUTOMATION FACILITY

Goal: To contribute quick service to students regarding registration, admission, examination, result, feedback and various other processes through full automation of administrative office, Knowledge Resource Centre (Central Library), Mentor Groups (*Whatsapp*) and college website.

The context: Our institution is situated in rural, hilly and remote area hence, most of our students belong

to this region. They have to travel from their villages to college by State

Transport Bus or other private vehicles. Some students have to take a walk of 3 to 5 kilometres to attend college. Most of the time it becomes time consuming for them to wait for various official procedures like registration, admission, examination forms submission, examinations, results etc. and other various procedures.

The Practice: Our institution is keen at solving problems of our students. We have provided online registration and admission facility for our students. The office is fully automated. We use CIMS software for keeping students' record. For issuing various receipts, the software is very much useful. We have provided links for online registration and admission process on institution website www.pvpcollegepatoda.org through which much time and efforts of our students are saved. Our **Knowledge Resource Centre (Central Library) is fully**

automated. We use *LibMan* Software for accession and transaction of books. Similarly, we are personally connected with our students through Students Mentor Groups. We provide essential information like notifications etc. and study material to them through Mentor Groups. Apart from this, our institution has purchased an application for Online Teaching. The application '**VPC Edu**' is available on *Google Playstore* which is downloaded by more than 80% students. The application proved to be very useful for Online Teaching during pandemic. Students' Satisfaction Survey is conducted online in during last 02 years. The link for Students' Satisfaction Survey is available on college website. The students can easily get access to the link and fill their feedback online. Our institution has created Mentors' Groups through Whatsapp to counsel with students. We created 29 Mentors' Groups through which the students are connected and they are provided with necessary notifications, study material and other important information. **Free Wi-Fi facility** is provided to students in campus.

Evidence of Success: As we are well connected with of our students, most of their problems are solved quickly. All students-related official activities are completed online.

Despite of being located in rural and remote area, we successfully provide services to our students by taking advantage of Internet and online facilities.

Problems encountered and Resources Required: Purchase of a well developed software, lack of good internet connectivity in nearby villages, non-availability of Smart Phones with most of the students, were the problems initially encountered. Presently, about 70 to 75% of our students have Smart Phones. Other students can seek benefit of online facility through any Internet Café.
